Tomatillo, Husk Tomato

Tomatillo ‘Goldie’ 75 days

Small orange berry with a papery husk, fruits drop from the plant when ripe. Very prolific! Very sweet flavor for eating raw, or dried like raisins. Organic source.



Tomatillo ‘Tamayo’ 65 days

Good vigor, high yields with 2 ½ - 3” oz. fruit, Mexican husk green tomato, roast for salsa verde. Fruits hold longer than other varieties.



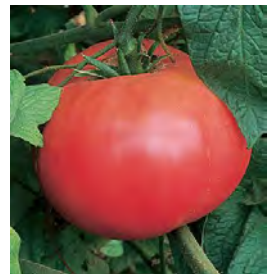
Tomato

Indeterminate Tomatoes

Indeterminate tomatoes grow all season and have no set limit to their height or sprawl. This means they produce fruit all season, but do require support, ample sun, regular watering and rich soil. An indeterminate tomato is NOT a good choice for containers or patio gardening.

‘Brandywine Red’ 75-85 days

Heirloom, very tasty with low acidity, higher yield with cool temperatures. Beefsteak type fruit, perfect for slicing. 16-30 oz. fruit, indeterminate.



‘Buffalosun’ 85 days

Large yellow fruit with red/orange flames and a marbled interior. All American Selection. High yields with 18-24 oz. flat, ribbed fruit. Few seeds and meaty texture. Disease resistant and indeterminate.



'Cherokee Purple'	72-90 days	Heirloom. Flavorful purple-brown fruit with a dusty pink interior. 10-12 oz. fruit, slightly flattened on short vines. Indeterminate. Organic source.	
'Chocolate Sprinkles'	50-55 days	Cherry type, red/green striped, bite sized, 1.5" fruit. Sweet-tart flavor and resists cracking. Good disease resistance. Indeterminate.	
'Honey Bee'	60 days	Beautiful red-yellow cherry. Excellent flavor with high yields and reduced cracking. Resistant to Fusarium (1-2), gray leaf spot, late blight, and verticillium wilt. Compact Indeterminate.	
'Genuwine'	70-75 days	Heirloom marriage cross between Brandywine and Costoluto Genovese. Matures 12-19 days earlier than Brandywine. Beefsteak type, with 10-11 oz. ribbed fruit, excellent for slicing. Indeterminate.	
'German Johnson'	75 days	Pink heirloom tomato. More vigorous and higher yielding than other Brandywine types. 8-16 oz fruits have deep, acidic flavor and rich, creamy texture. Indeterminate. Organic Source.	
'Juliet'	60 days	Grape to Roma type, with deep red, shiny fruits in heavy clusters. High yielding with high disease and crack resistance. 1.5-2 oz. fruit is good in salads, salsa and sauce. All American Selection. One of our favorites! Indeterminate.	

'Mortgage Lifter'	80 days	Heirloom. Beefsteak type with red-pink, slightly ribbed fruit. Consistent winner in taste tests. Fruit is 18-28 oz. or larger with few seeds. Indeterminate.	
'New Girl'	62 days	First tomatoes of the season! Dependable, early producer with high disease resistance and great flavor. Better than Early Girl, with 4-6 oz. fruit. Indeterminate. Organic source.	
'Pineapple'	85-95 days	Heirloom. Large beefsteak type with bright yellow and red striped fruit. Meaty texture and a sweet, mild flavor with a high yield of 18-24 oz. fruit. Indeterminate.	
'Prudens Purple'	72 days	Heirloom. Large to extra-large, dark pink fruit. Potato-leaf variety. Crack-resistant with very meaty fruits and few seeds. Excellent flavor. Indeterminate.	
'San Marzano'	70 days	Heirloom. Classic red plum type, excellent for sauce. Compact 40" plants produce 4-6 oz. fruit that are easy to peel. Indeterminate. Organic source.	
'Sun Gold'	65 days	Cherry type, small orange fruit. Perfect for snacking right off the vine. 1 oz. fruit with a tangy, sweet flavor and prolific growth. Skin is thinner than 'Sunsugar'. Indeterminate.	
'Sun Sugar'	62 days	Cherry type, gold-orange fruit. Very sweet with good crack resistance. 1 oz. fruit can be harvested almost daily. One of our favorites! Indeterminate.	

‘Super Fantastic’ 70 days Beefsteak type, dark red, sweet fruit. Good disease resistance. Meaty, smooth-skinned, 10 oz. fruit produced all summer. Indeterminate.



‘Supersweet 100’ 57-62 days Cherry type, small red fruit grow in long hanging clusters. 1 oz. fruit is sweet and prolific. Kids love these. Indeterminate.



‘Tidy Treats’ 60-65 days Best cherry for patio gardens! Tasty and high-yielding with a sweet flavor. Easily supported with a standard tomato cage. Compact indeterminate. Short like determinate tomato with productivity of an indeterminate tomato.



‘Whopping Red’ 60-65 days Large slicing tomato. Crack-resistant. High production. Excellent disease resistance.



‘Woodstock’ 75 days 8-12oz beefsteak. Green-pink bicolor tomato. It’s ripe when the bottom gets a pink blush. Rich, sugary, acidic flavor. Excellent disease resistance. This is a new variety for us, so let us know what you think!





Determinate Tomatoes

Determinate tomatoes will grow to a certain height and then stop. They do not continue growing or setting fruit all summer, though the ones we grow are prolific in their season. Determinate tomatoes are great for containers and patio gardening as they don’t take as much space as indeterminate tomatoes. They may still require some support especially when fruiting, but not extensive trellising. Standard tomato cages work well for determinate tomatoes. Provide rich media, lots of sun and water and enjoy the harvest!

‘Bush Champion II’ 65 days One of the best for small gardens, containers, and patios. These compact plants only grow to 24-30” and produce extra-early 8-12 oz fruits. Great flavor and good disease resistance. Determinate.



'Galahad'	65-70 days	Mid-sized red slicing tomato. Early-fruiting and fantastic flavor in round, 7-12 oz fruit. Great disease resistance. Determinate. Organic source.	
'Summerlast'	55-65 days	Cherry type, red fruit. Dwarf plant is excellent for small spaces or patio containers. High yields of 1-2 oz. round fruit. Late blight resistant. Determinate.

'Abe Lincoln Original'	80 days	Heirloom Slicer, red fruit with thick flesh and small seed core. Great flavor! From the original 1923 Buckbees catalog. Indeterminate plant with high yields. Resists sunburn.	
'Black Beauty'	80 days	Slicer, blue-black skin, red flesh with rich, savory flavor. Stores well. Indeterminate plant	
'Brad's Atomic Grape'	75 days	Elongated cherries. It's just so pretty! Fruits are striped with purple, yellow, orange, red and green. Fruit holds well on vine and off. Crack-resistant, extremely sweet fruit. Indeterminate.	
'Brown Sugar'	70-85 days	Russian Heirloom. Slicer. Produces 7-ounce fruit with lovely red-brown skin and flesh. Smokey-sugar sweet fruits are great for snacking, slicing and saucing. Indeterminate.	

‘Emalia’	70-80 days	Heirloom. Caramel-colored saladette tomato from France. Wine-colored flesh is sweet and intensely flavored. Long and pointy with thick skin, these are definitely different! Use these delicious beauties for snacking, salsa or sauces. Indeterminate.
‘Hungarian Heart’	80 days	Heirloom. Reddish-pink, heart-shaped. Medium-large slicers. Dense-meaty flesh with few seeds is perfect for saucing, and canning. Also great on a sandwich. Crack-resistant. Long season of heavy production. Indeterminate
‘Mushroom Basket’	75 days	Heirloom. Slicer. Large, reddish-pink with lots of ribs and pleats. Beautiful fruits are sweet and mild-flavored. Firm flesh with few seeds. Delicious for slicing and making paste. Indeterminate
‘Orange Peach’	75 days	Descendent of old French Heirloom. 1.5-3” fruits. Peach-colored with slightly fuzzy skin! Sweet with a fantastic flavor. Can even be used to make peach-like jam! One of our favorites!
